Dear St. Anthony School 'Ohana,

May Day is Lei Day in Hawai'i, and our students have been busily preparing for our annual May Day Program. The theme for this year's program is **"E Hele Mai Hula me A'u - Come Dance with Me"** and the children have been practicing their dances to perform for you tomorrow Friday, May 4th at 8:15 a.m. in the courtyard. Thank you to the families who donated plants, flowers and greenery for the decorations, and for helping us set up tonight! Thank you also to those who have generously volunteered to bring and set up a pop-up tent for your child's class to have some shade or rain shelter! Set up will begin early tomorrow morning around 6:30 a.m. on and the pop-up tents should be tied down to cinder blocks or buckets, so please bring something to secure them. Tomorrow, we will also be celebrating and honoring our **Blessed Mother Mary with a May Crowning** of flowers and lei.

For our May Day program, parking will be limited, with the Outreach parking lot and street available. Please be a good neighbor and park safely and not block driveways.

The band, choir, and hula halau will begin the program at 8:15 a.m. and the show will end around 10:00 a.m. The PTSG is hosting a parent booth distributing light morning refreshments and coffee and juice from 7:00 to 8:15 a.m. near the bike rack at May Day! Please be sure to stop by and visit them. There will be no Hawaiian plate lunch service this year, so all **children in After School Care will need a home lunch. Dismissal is at 12:00 p.m.** on this day.

May Day is a great tradition at St. Anthony School! Many hours go into the May Day Program and the children love to see their families in attendance. We hope you can join us!

Enrollment Forms and Summer School:

Thank you to the families who have completed their **Enrollment Forms** for the upcoming year. Having accurate numbers is essential to our school so that we can complete our planning. Please be sure to recommend our school to your friends and family members as we will continue to enroll new families. **Summer School registration** is still ongoing, and forms can be turned into the office. The five week, half day classes help to strengthen and enrich students through the summer. We may be offering the Title 1 classes in reading and math for students who are part of this program. It's a great way to build reading and math skills!

An Education at St. Anthony School:

We know that parents have choices in the education of their child and that one concern of any parent is if St. Anthony School will adequately prepare their child for high schools. We are confident that our middle school students are prepared and competitive for admission at all of our island high schools. To instill that same confidence in our parents, here are our current 8th graders' acceptance statistics: We have 14 graduates who collectively submitted a total of 45 applications to various high schools across Hawaii. Our acceptance rates were 100% for applicants to Catholic high schools (Maryknoll, Sacred Hearts, Damien, and St. Louis.) All 10 of our 14 graduates who applied for admission at a Catholic high school were accepted. We also had a 100% acceptance rate at Le Jardin (7 of 7 applicants), Mid-Pac (4 of 4 applicants) and Trinity Christian (3 of 3 applicants). Our students are extremely competitive for admission at all private schools. We had a 70% acceptance rate for applicants to Punahou and 7 of our



graduates were offered admission. Of our four 8th grade applicants to Kamehameha Schools, 3 were offered admission and one was wait-listed. Two of our sixth graders were also offered admission at Kamehameha Schools and two of our 8th graders were offered admission at Iolani School. Our graduates who chose to go to a public high school can take advance classes in Spanish, join the band and chose advance academic courses. **We are proud of all our graduates and we are confident they will go out to make their mark in the world!**

When it Breaks, it Pours:

Due to a water pipe leak, two of the Early Learning Center classrooms experienced some flooding that resulted in new carpeting and repairs to two classrooms. We are happy to say that repairs are completed and the classrooms are now open. **Thanks for your patience!**



Welcome:

We are happy to introduce you to some of our new staff members. In the preschool, PK2 we've enjoyed having a new aide, **Mrs. Faith Burroughs**. Faith comes to us from Pennsylvania, where she worked as an Early Education teacher. We also welcome, **Mrs. Suad Lacalamito** into our cafeteria/school kitchen. Mrs. Lacalamito brings her cooking skills and desire to spice up our lunches, having already introduced some new tasty entrees.

Big Island Adventure:

The **Fourth Graders** had a fantastic trip to the **Big Island of Hawaii on April 9, 10, and 11**. The students flew into Kona accompanied by their teacher Mrs.

While at the park, they experienced walking through lava tubes, hiking to see Pele's tears and watching the active lava lake at Halema'uma'u Crater. The students have been preparing in school learning about the gifts of these sacraments, along with their parents and god parents who have been attending many Family Session classes on the weekend, instilling our Catholic faith belief that parents are the primary educators of their children. Learning about God and living it in our day to day life is modeled at home and we want our families to know that we are praying for you as you continue to grow in your family's faith life. **The Second Graders will celebrate Communion and Confirmation on Saturday, May 19th at the 5:00pm Mass. The students in grades 3-8th will be confirmed at the 8:30 a.m. on Sunday, May 20th. High School siblings will also receive their Confirmation that day at the 6:00 p.m. Mass.** Lots of celebrations and blessings to all!

Religious Education:

We also want to welcome to our parish **Mrs. Cindy Kaul**, mother of Raleigh (Gr. 4) and Ransom (Gr.6) who will become **the Director of Religious Education**.
